6:37 **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** presented by Mark

- Decision has been confirmed that the school district will reconfigure for fall 2012. How this affects choice schools will be decided over the next two years, but there will not be a different configurations for choice schools.

# 7:55 **NEW BUSINESS/Q&A** presented by Jill

- Brainstorming session about encouraging attendance to the monthly community meetings (which is stated as a requirement for attending DCS in the Family Participation Commitment sheet we all signed at some point), possible ways to make up absences, and consequences for consistent absences. What are the biggest stumbling blocks for attendance, what do we as a community most need our families to get from these meetings, how can we do to make them better? Do many families feel they are optional or even unnecessary? We get about 60% attendance at most meetings. 25 families (out of 54, I think) have missed three or more meetings. Numbers are based on the log-in sheet laid out by the agenda at each meeting.
- Might think about how will DCS grow/change over the future with the new building and the new configuration. Maybe that will bring people out.
- Are we covering enough new material to be meeting every month? Can we cover the same amount in fewer meetings? Is there something we can accomplish (work sessions)? Special topics to discuss?
- Need ways to make the meetings relevant. Currently much is brought up through email and recaptured after the meeting in the minutes. Perhaps by having them break up into committees during the meeting to work on the committee.
- Does a discussion need to take place about what this school stands for and what we want to see?
- How about varying the meeting? Different format of meeting each month, varying days of the week to meet, other ideas thrown out.
- More discussion about volunteer hours and procedures?
- Creating a list of multiple talents, and then use that as a basis for getting folks involved in regard to their specific talents.
- ACTION ITEM: Recommend that every committee chair write up what your committee does; what skills that are useful for it; and the load needed to help out with that committee.
