We have money, and we are a third of the way through our donations collected. There are more partial payments than there usually are. Budget was for 13.4 K and we are at about 4.4 K. Discussion about getting donations in earlier as well as how to remind people on how to do it online. If you use online banking use the same address for the school as on the magnets. Only thing over budget is the olders' field trip budget, but their remaining field trips are free.

They have spent a lot of the budget in the Fall Homework club, so looking at how to fund the Winter/Spring Homework club – need roughly \$5000 to cover both. Looking at increasing the fees applied to students as well as increase the budget or perhaps looking for a volunteer to cover instead of paying for a second teacher (the second teacher is there as a safety issue not a teaching issue). Discussion on the number of kids and what is needed at these. Suggestions included: students working towards becoming teachers at Northwest University as well as UW-Bothell

Fun Run made the goal and some with matching gifts really making the difference. There is a committee looking at what to do with the excess funds. Dawn is on this committee and they are taking teacher submissions first.

Surplus funds requests

Stability ball seating for the rest of DCS – cost of approximately \$1000 for 44 more balls (using a different vendor which is less expensive, but research seems to point that the product is comparable in quality). Things have been working well in the olders, so the teachers who had been waiting to see how it worked out are now behind it. The only issue now is the storing for the youngers class. Suggestion that this come out of classroom improvement; thus not a surplus fund request and does not need to go to Community.

Professional Art Teacher – cost of \$400 to hire a professional teacher/artist who will teach Chinese Ink Painting and Cartoon for 4 one hour sessions with each the youngers and the middles. Discussion of whether to take it out of other budget items. No objection, so moved to Community with the recommendation of Steering

Leslie Paige (Music class teacher who comes over from Henry David Thoreau Elementary to help out here) – because she travels over from Thoreau she cannot bring over all the instruments. Wants to get instruments purchased so they can be kept here. Discussion on why the spill over class doesn't have access to the instruments that non-spill over classroom already has. Recommend \$250 be sent to Paige to get some immediate needs; and then Dawn will take this request to PTSA. No objection to this, approved unanimously

Discussion on how much should be spent on surplus funds based on needs in the future and rainy day funds. Surplus has been hovering around \$20k; the budget has hovered around \$25k (for non-revenue neutral items). Discussion of looking at the next budget to determine what is essential so that a meaningful discussion could be made in regard to how much money should be held for a rainy day fund.

Start planning for this year's 4th graders who will graduate next year as 5th graders – some things to think about:

Should graduation ceremonies be two separate parties or one large one? Is there a difference in the type of celebration? Just something to think about as this is a DCS issue as opposed to a district issue. Discussion on who should be involved this decision – Monica, parents, the kids.

Outdoor ed? – will the 5th graders go with the 6th graders OR will the district send the 6th graders from middle schools? Mark said everyone is aware of these issues, but this has not come up yet at the district level, because they are just starting to work through the issues with the reconfiguration.
