The statements from the bank were showing more money than the books were showing, and reconciliation showed show 8 checks written over the last 4 years have still not been cashed. These checks are no longer valid, and the account has been reconciled with the

bank.

On the paperwork end, new checks were ordered with "valid for 90 days" printed on the checks to help keep the accounts straight. Paperwork has been filed with the state for renewal of non-profit status and appropriate work with the IRS.

No one is over budget right now.
